Student Council Introduction / Official Organization Explanation

The term "official organization" refers to groups that are recognized by the Student Council and the university. In total, there are three types of organizations: clubs, official circles, and committees. The committees are responsible for the day-to-day administrative work and management of group activities to ensure that they run smoothly. Clubs are provided with club rooms and funding from the Student Council. Official circles are allowed to use oncampus facilities, although clubs are given priority when making reservations.

Circles that wish to become clubs are required to submit various documents to the Student Council through the university's Student Affairs Center, meet the designated promotion requirements, and undergo a screening process in accordance with the rules and regulations.
